

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

February 28, 2017

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, February 28, 2017, at 8:30 A.M. All members were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on February 21, 2017, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Finkel moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under old business, Mayor DeBaun said he had a request by First Christian Church asking for a parking lot variance, and because improvements are to be made on the site, the Church is formally asking to use the City's parking lot for Sunday's. Mayor DeBaun said First Christian and First United Methodist Churches use of the City's parking lot on Sunday's is not causing problems for anyone. Mr. Williams moved to approve the request, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mayor DeBaun said Scott Fuchs had presented site plans for outside seating with dimensional data, and he said his main concern was with the trash can's location. He said it could be moved in any direction. Building and Plan Commission Director Bryant Niehoff said he met with Scott last Thursday, and everything seemed to be okay. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the request so long as the trash can is in a suitable location, and the State gives its okay for putting fencing around outside seats into the concrete. Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Scott had something else to bring before the Board. He thought it would be good if the City had a trolley going around town like it did decades ago. He saw one in Memphis, but they were on tracks, and he didn't want one like that. He thought it could attract tourists. Mayor DeBaun said he's talked about different things like that, trying to figure out how to capture some of those who go to the Casino, and different transportation options.

There was no new business.

There being no further business, Mr. Williams moved to adjourn.
