

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

April 25, 2017

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, April 25, 2017, at 8:29 A.M. Mr. Williams was absent, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Finkel moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on April 18, 2017, and Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0 voice vote.

Mr. Finkel moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0 voice vote.

Under old business, City Engineer Matt House requested that the Board accept the low bid from Atwood Concrete for the Evans Street project. Their amount was \$313,751.00. Mr. Finkel moved to accept Atwood Concrete's bid, and Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0 voice vote.

Under new business, WRRF Superintendent Brad Fix requested permission to allow SCUFFY to have road blocks this Saturday at Mechanic and Harrison, and Lee Blvd. and Progress Parkway, from 9:00 A.M. until 1:00 P.M. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the requests, and Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0 voice vote.

Building and Plan Commission Director Bryant Niehoff said he had a request from ABATE of Indiana wanting to place twelve yard card signs around town under the community activity message provision of the UDO. He said it's being done to promote motorcycle safety and awareness month in Indiana, and they would like the signs put up two to three weeks before May 21. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the request, and Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on 2-0 voice vote.

Brandy Coomes, Executive Director of Mainstreet Shelbyville, requested permission to close the east side of the Circle overnight Friday evening and Saturday morning, from May 20 until October 7, for the Farmer's Market. She is still debating whether they will have a Wednesday Farmer's Market this year. For the First Friday event coming up May 5, Brandy asked permission to close the east and west side of the Circle after 1:00 P.M. on May 5, giving the group time to set up for a car show on the east side, and a thoroughbred horse, from Indiana Grand, on the west side. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the schedules as presented, and Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0 voice vote.


Two gentlemen were in attendance who talked with two Board members a couple weeks ago after the meeting. Mayor DeBaun was in Japan at that time. Mr. Finkel said these two were advocates on behalf of establishing a standard for the new piping at Twin Lakes. Mayor DeBaun asked Matt House to work with the two gentlemen, and give a recommendation to the Board for the standards overall. Mayor DeBaun said he would appreciate it if the Board could see some of the pipes that have been underground for some time. The Mayor also asked Brad Fix if he could contact his folks in Franklin, and find out about the park, and how it's lasted. Mr. Finkel moved to give variance construction standards, for Twin Lakes, for sections to be determined by the City Engineer of the new flexible pipe to be installed with additional inspection and documentation. Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0 voice vote.

There being no further business, Mr. Finkel moved to adjourn.
