

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

May 23, 2017

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, May 23, 2017, at 8:31 A.M. All members were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on May 16, 2017, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under old business, this was done after new business today, because of several time-consuming questions concerning Zayo Group's request last week to place new poles in the right-of-ways. The poles would house a small cell antenna mounted atop the new pole, and pole mounted radio and power equipment. Leonard Strickland, with Zayo Group in Indianapolis, came to answer the Board's questions. After answering many questions, The Board felt it would be better if they visited Speedway to see their operation of cell towers. Mr. Strickland said he could meet the Board in Speedway to see if they have questions, and he would ask if Speedway officials would be interested in sharing a few minutes on their thoughts and premises about the small cell towers. It was decided not to visit Speedway until after the Indy 500 race.

Under new business, Street Commissioner Jennifer Jones noted there would not be any trash pickup next Monday, because of Memorial Day. Monday's and Tuesday's trash will be picked up on Tuesday.

Brandy Coomes, with Main Street Shelbyville, requested permission to close the East Washington St. public lot on Friday, June 16 for the Wine-Walk event to be held from 5:30 until 10:30 P.M. The east side needs to be closed Friday morning to prepare. Also, Brandy said the restoration company that has the Balsaer statue will be here working on the pedestal to prepare to re-install him this Thursday on the Public Square. Mr. Finkel moved to approve Brandy's request, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Jeff Scott, president of Shelby County Habitat for Humanity, requested permission to close a road for a second annual car show on August 26. He would like to close Marketplace Blvd. from Duran Drive to E. Michigan Road. If it rains on that Saturday, Jeff said the backup date would be Sunday, August 27. Cars are to check in at 10:30 and the show and festivities will be from 11:00 A.M. until 3:00 P.M. Mr. Williams moved to approve the request, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

There being no further business, Mr. Williams moved to adjourn.
