

## BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

June 27, 2017

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, June 27, 2017, at 8:29 A.M. All members were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Finkel moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on June 20, 2017, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Finkel moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under old business, Doug Brown requested permission to allow his son, Mitch, a.k.a. Kid Quill, to close W. South St. from Miller Ave. to Montgomery St., on July 2, from 10:30 A.M. until 3:00 P.M. Doug said they plan to do a music video on the block, and he will work with the Police Department to post temporary no parking signs and barricades in the area. Mitch said he walked the neighborhood yesterday, passed flyers out to everyone and notified them of the event. Mr. Williams moved to approve the request, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under new business, Khalilah Palmer requested permission to close the east half of the Circle on August 5, from 2:00 P.M. until 5:00 P.M., with a rain date of August 12. This is for a block party for bringing community awareness to the Excel Center. Mr. Williams moved to approve the request, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote. Because the Farmer's Market is held on the east half of the Circle that day, Mayor DeBaun said the east half will remain closed until the event is concluded.

Street Commissioner Jennifer Jones announced there would be no trash picked up on Tuesday, July 4 and it would be picked up the next day, along with Wednesday's trash. The blue recycling containers will be picked up starting Monday, July 10, the same as their trash day.

The next Board of Works meeting will be held Monday, July 3, and on the following week, the Board meeting will be held on Thursday, July 13.

Mr. Williams asked Jennifer if she would give an update on the blue recycling containers that have been delivered around the City. She said they ran into a problem yesterday because they ordered 5,000, anticipating several would not want to participate in the program, but only around 300 have said no so far, and they don't have enough containers. Jennifer had to place a new rush order, but she said it will take time to get them, so some might not receive the containers before the July 10 starting time.

Mayor DeBaun said he walked the Evans Street project last night, noting there was an elevated sidewalk with handrails, and the widening of the street is a great improvement to the neighborhood. He extended his compliments to all who have been involved with the project.


Mayor DeBaun announced that City controlled flags will be flown at half-staff today from 12 noon until 8:00 P.M., in memory of the City's Airport manager, Darrell Shrader. Darrell passed away unexpectedly on Thursday, June 22. Mr. Finkel had many nice things to say about Darrell being a fantastic pilot and flight instructor, teaching a generation of pilots how to fly, which included Mr. Finkel himself. Mayor DeBaun said Darrell gave him his first airplane ride in 1975, saying he'll never forget the experience.

Mayor DeBaun read three quotes on the Amos Road storm sewer project. The company and amounts are listed below:

M & C Excavating	\$90,100.00

Mr. Williams moved to take the bids under advisement, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was approved to take the bids under advisement by a 3-0 voice vote.

There being no further business, Mr. Finkel moved to adjourn.
