

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

August 15, 2017

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, August 15, 2017, at 8:28 A.M. All members were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on August 8, 2017, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under old business, Mayor DeBaun talked about the blight elimination program homes at 731 S. West St. and 29 John St., that are to be demolished. Since asbestos was found in the homes, there was a change order presented by Robertson Paving to remove the asbestos first. The grand total is \$7,370.00, which would be added to be paid after the job is completed. The original bid approved to demolish the homes was \$24,500.00. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the asbestos removal change order, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under new business, Mayor DeBaun said Main Street Shelbyville requested permission to change the location of the Brewfest on September 23, from the Public Square to W. Washington St. Brandy Coombs, Executive Director of Main Street, said First Federal Bank's drive thru would be open, but west from the alley would be closed to set the stage by Tompkins St., and the rest would be set up with tables, chairs, breweries, and barbecue. She said the event will last from 5:30 to 10:00 P.M., with most things being cleaned up by 11:00 P.M. Mr. Williams moved to approve the request, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.


On September 22, Amy Haacker, Executive Director of Blue River Foundation, said she would like to have a celebration of the ribbon cutting ceremony at the Blue River Trailhead event with local and State officials attending. She said the Foundation would take care of all of the details and asked for the Board's approval. Mr. Finkel moved to approve Amy's request, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mayor DeBaun welcomed the Japanese visitors from our Sister City on their first full day in Shelbyville, and talked about some of their plans while visiting. A warm welcome and applause was extended to our Sister City visitors. Many pictures were taken after the Board meeting concluded.

There being no further business, Mr. Williams moved to adjourn.
