

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

July 3, 2018

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, July 3, 2018, at 8:32 A.M. All members were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on June 26, 2018, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.


Under old business, Michelle Romanoski said she met with Main Street, Police, and Fire officials about having her event about addicts lives matter on July 28, and it was decided to have it at the Farmer's Market location, instead of on the Circle. The Board wanted her to start it at 1:00 P.M. instead of 12 noon to give people time to leave the Farmer's Market that closes on Saturday's at noon. The event will end at 6:00 P.M. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the request, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

City Engineer Matt House came forward saying he finally got a traffic plan from O'Mara on their bid for the Casino Overlay and Patchwork project that was bid on June 5, 2018. Matt said they would restrict one lane at a time, with flaggers at each end. Mayor DeBaun wanted to make sure they wouldn't be doing this when the Indiana Derby event is being held on July 14, and Matt said they were made aware of that event. The work would take just over a week to complete, and it is supposed to be finished by September 1. Mr. Finkel moved to approve O'Mara's bid of \$190,140.97, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.


Under new business, Street Commissioner Jennifer Jones came forward saying there would not be any trash or recycling picked up tomorrow, July 4. The trash and recycling would be picked up on Thursday, and if all of the recycling wasn't picked up then, it would be done on Friday. Since today was Jennifer's last day as Street Commissioner, Mayor DeBaun presented her with a plaque in appreciation of her 6 ½ years of service.

Tom Batton, who lives in Fountain Lake, came forward asking permission to have a block party tonight, and closing two sections off for the fireworks event. He asked permission to close the small section of road from Rampart to Fountain Lake Drive, and said there were two other ways to get into the addition. It would be from 9:00 P.M. to around 11:00 P.M., and there would be barricades set up. All Board members thought it was a great idea. Mr. Williams moved to approve the request, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

There being no further business, Mr. Williams moved to adjourn.
