

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

July 24, 2018

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, July 24, 2018, at 8:32 A.M. All members were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on July 17, 2018, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0-1 voice vote, with Mayor DeBaun abstaining.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

There was no old business.

Under new business, Mayor DeBaun said he had a request to issue an order to appear on property owner Timothy Haehl, at 409 Colescott St. Mr. Haehl has not been in compliance with the Code Enforcement Officer's request, so at least ten days notice will be required to be sent. Mr. Williams moved to have Mr. Haehl appear at the August 7 Board meeting, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.


Brandy Coomes, Executive Director of Main Street Shelbyville, spoke on behalf of the First Friday events in Shelbyville. She requested permission to close the west half of the Circle on Friday, August 3, and closing it at midnight the night before. She's also trying to secure the parking lot behind the Methodist Building, and its alley around 4:30 P.M. that Friday. The alley would be between W. Washington and W. Franklin St., and it would be used for children's activities. Mr. Williams moved to approve the request, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.


On a new dog bite case, Mayor DeBaun asked Brett Lanpher, 149 W. Washington St., to come forward and tell the Board what happened on July 11. Brett said he wasn't home at the time of the incident, but he was called and told what happened. His nine year old son opened a door and the pit-bull ran out and attacked a dog in the alley. The person whose dog was bitten did not appear today. Brett said his fiancée went out and secured the dog. Mr. Finkel said he visited the dog at the Animal Shelter and it didn't show any aggression toward him. When he put his hand up to the fence, as he always does to see each dog's reaction, this dog licked his hand. Brett said he's taking care of this dog for someone who is doing ambassador relief in Mississippi until she returns later this month. Since it wasn't known if the dog has had all of its immunization shots, the dog couldn't be released until verification is made. Mr. Williams moved to approve releasing the dog once verification has been made that all immunization shots have been done, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under other business, Mr. Finkel wanted to thank the citizens of Shelbyville for their patience while crews have been working on St. Rd. 9, many streets in the City, and a few of the railroad crossings in the city have been worked on to make for better rides over the tracks.

There being no further business, Mr. Williams moved to adjourn.
