

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

August 14, 2018

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, August 14, 2018, at 8:34 A.M. All members were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on August 7, 2018, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

There was no old business.

Under new business, Mayor DeBaun said Margaret Beglin requested permission to temporarily close a portion of Marketplace Blvd. from 8:00 A.M. until 3:00 P.M. on Saturday, August 25. This is being done to accommodate the third annual Hot Rods for Humanity Car Show. At this location, it won't restrict access traffic to any businesses on St. Rd. 44. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the request, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.


Mayor DeBaun said the next request was to have a closure on E. Locust St. this Saturday, August 18, from 9:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M. There will be a benefit for Cole West. Police Chief Mark Weidner said that if the block from Harrison St. to Pike can't be closed, then he would at least like it to be closed from the east entrance at Grandma's Restaurant to Pike St. City Engineer Matt House is supposed to check with the State to see whether or not the block can be closed, and then he's to contact Mark to make the final decision. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the request, giving latitude to the Police Chief to make a final decision on the actual closure, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mayor DeBaun said there was a request to make the alley that goes east and west, behind the Eagles Lodge, and between the SCUFFY building and Fifth Third Bank, run one way going west onto N. Harrison St. Mr. Williams moved to approve the request, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

John Koch came forward saying that his mother, Phyllis Koch, passed away a couple of weeks ago, and that she was an animal lover. John handed Clerk-Treasurer Zerr an envelope to give to the Mayor. John said the letter could be opened. Enclosed was a \$500.00 check and donation made payable to the Shelbyville/Shelby County Animal Shelter. The gift was a wish upon her death. Her children, John Koch and Terri Koch-Curson were named in the letter. Mayor DeBaun, the Board, and all present gave a round of applause thanking the Koch family.

Mayor DeBaun welcomed all of the Japanese students and their chaperones who are visiting from our Sister City.

There being no further business, Mr. Williams moved to adjourn.
