

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

September 11, 2018

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, September 11, 2018, at 8:33 A.M. Mr. Finkel was absent, attending to school business, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on September 4, 2018, and Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0 voice vote.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0 voice vote.

Under old business, Mayor DeBaun said one bid was received for the Japanese Garden. He said it was from McIntire Lawn and Landscape. The following amounts were read: \$42,930.00 for the bid total; \$2,920.00 for alternate 1; \$1,435.00 for alternate 2; and \$895.00 for one year of plant maintenance. Mr. Williams moved to take the bid under advisement, and Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0 voice vote.


Under new business, Karen Smith, owner of Capone's, said she is having a benefit tomorrow night, and is having Mel's Catering pull his truck in for dinner. She would like to reserve the two parking spaces in front of their business for the truck from around 5:00 P.M. until 11:00 P.M. Karen said the fundraiser is for St. Mary's Child Center. Mr. Williams moved to approve the request for two parking spaces in front of Capone's tomorrow evening, and Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0 voice vote.

Under other business, Mayor DeBaun said today was the 17th anniversary of the September 11 attack on the World Trade Center. He said it also fell on a Tuesday at a Board of Works meeting, when Clerk-Treasurer Zerr was Mayor. In the prelim meeting, the television was turned on to watch the second plane crash into the buildings. The meeting was held, and then everyone went back into the Mayor's office to watch for quite a long time. The discussion turned into, "what do we need to do locally". He said the Mayor and his staff organized a community rally on the Public Square, which showed the power of a small community putting something together.

Fire Chief Tony Logan came forward to thank the Mayor for his leadership over the weekend on the flood situation that the City encountered. He said a lot of hours were spent on preparing for what they were told was going to be a major disaster. Tony felt confident that if something had happened, the leadership team would have been able to handle it. Mayor DeBaun appreciated Tony's comments, saying several in the City and County spent many hours preparing in the joint effort. He said we were fortunate that the storm changed its track, and the total diminished on the rain. Mayor DeBaun said rain gauges went from 6 to over 10 inches of rain.

There being no further business, Mr. Williams moved to adjourn.
