

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

October 2, 2018

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, October 2, 2018, at 8:29 A.M. All members were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on September 25, 2018, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under old business, Mayor DeBaun said the ambulance bids opened last week, as well as the stop sign request made last week have been continued. The dog bite case heard last week has been resolved.

Under new business, David Lee Johnson came forward, saying he's the owner of Dave's Double Barrel BBQ. David said he would like to serve food on the Public Square on Friday's and Saturday's, and he has all of the necessary licenses required. On Friday's, he would like to serve from 3:00 P.M. until dark, and Saturday's from 12 noon to dark. Under discussion, Mr. Finkel wanted to be sure that whenever he does this, the Police and Street Department are aware to make sure the area is available for him. Also, he felt it would be good to do this on a trial basis for six weeks, see how it worked, regroup, and get feedback to see if any corrections are needed. David agreed with Mr. Finkel, saying he thought that was a good idea, and he can't make it every weekend because he has other commitments sometimes. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the request for six weeks, allowing two days per week, and Mr. Williams seconded. Mr. Johnson agreed to get with the Street Department when he's ready to get started. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.


