

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

October 9, 2018

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, October 9, 2018, at 8:33 A.M. All members were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Finkel moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on October 2, 2018, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Finkel moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under old business, Fire Chief Tony Logan met with his officers and recommended to the Board the three E450 Type III Ambulances, through Fire Service, Inc., saying they were best for the community. The bids were opened on September 25, 2018, and the cost will be \$588,174.00. Mr. Finkel said the old ambulances will be sold, which will help reduce the overall cost. Mr. Finkel moved to approve Chief Logan's request, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.


Mayor DeBaun said it was requested that a potential stop sign be placed at the intersection of Locust and Miller Streets. After hearing from the Police Chief and reviewing the location individually, the Board decided there was no action necessary at this time. The Mayor said trees would have to be removed, there would be lost parking, and there was a stacking concern to the north that might cause traffic to back up into other intersections.

Mayor DeBaun said there was a request two weeks ago to have stop signs placed at Meridian and Doran Avenue. After reviewing the area and talking with the Police Chief, it was felt that instead of putting in stop signs, it was better to install 20 miles per hour speed limits in that area. He asked the Street Department to install the signs.


Under new business, Mayor DeBaun said he had a request from a group called Community Awareness – Time for Change, that is asking to close the east side of the interior of the Public Square, on October 20 for a candlelight vigil, at 3:00 P.M. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the request, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Finkel wanted to compliment Knauf for the party they threw on the Public Square Friday night, and he liked the way they utilized the Public Square, showing the great potential of what that location has. Other than all of their planning and funding, Mayor DeBaun said the real reason was that there was no traffic.

There being no further business, Mr. Williams moved to adjourn.
