

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

October 23, 2018

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, October 23, 2018, at 8:27 A.M. All members were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on October 16, 2018, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Before starting, Mayor DeBaun wanted to welcome all of the Japanese visitors to the Board of Works meeting. He invited the interpreter to come forward so she could translate the Mayor's description of when, how often the Board meets, what type of topics are discussed, and that the Board members are appointed by the Mayor.

Under old business, Mr. Finkel moved to continue the QC Communications hearing until further information comes from the attorneys involved, and the City Engineer with their recommendations. Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was made to continue the case on a 3-0 voice vote.

City Engineer Matt House came forward to recommend Superior Contractors for their low bid last week for a floodwall on River Road. Their bid was \$26,750.00. Mayor DeBaun said texture and coloring were talked about being done as well, at a cost of around \$10,000.00. Mr. Finkel moved to accept the bid from Superior Contractors, as well as adding up to \$10,000.00 for the texture and coloring. Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.


Plan Commission Director Bryant Niehoff came forward to recommend Robertson Paving for their bid opened last week on the Blight Elimination Program's removal of three homes, at a cost of \$31,000.00. Mr. Williams moved to accept Robertson Paving's bid, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.


Under new business, City Council President Rob Nolley welcomed the Japanese delegation to this morning's Board meeting. He went on to talk about the past six Mayors attending last night's 30th anniversary Sister-City event at Indiana Grand Casino. All Japanese companies from Shelbyville had representatives attend the celebration. Councilman Nolley introduced members from Shizuoka City, and then each of the City Council members present introduced themselves, as well as the City's Department Heads.

The Deputy Mayor from Shizuoka City and an interpreter came forward to thank everyone for their hospitality, saying they are having a very nice time with everyone, and they were interested to see how the Board of Works does its business.

There being no further business, Mr. Finkel moved to adjourn.
