

## COMMON COUNCIL

Regular Meeting

October 15, 2018

The regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Common Council Chambers of City Hall on Monday, October 15, 2018, at 8:32 A.M. Councilwoman Bowen opened with the Pledge of Allegiance, and Councilman Ridgeway followed that with a prayer. Councilmen Carmony, Nolley, and Asher were absent, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Councilman Wright moved to approve the minutes of the October 1, 2018 meeting, and Councilwoman Bowen seconded. The motion was carried on a 4-0 voice vote.

Before going to old business, Mayor DeBaun made a point of order because three members were absent. He said all votes will require a unanimous vote today to be effective.

Under old business, on Ordinance No. 18-2844, Councilwoman Bowen moved to approve the annexation of 7.675 acres for Timber Creek Village on second and final reading, and Councilman Wright seconded. The motion was carried on a 4-0 voice vote.

Under new business, on Resolution No. 2018-18, amending Resolution No. 2010-5, Councilman Phares moved to approve the amendment, and Councilwoman Bowen seconded. Under discussion, Mayor DeBaun said new language was added to put a limit on what can be spent before being sent to the Finance Committee, and then before the entire City Council. Councilman Ridgeway said that although he will approve this today, he felt the percentages could be done to get a better conclusion. Also, he felt more line items on the budget would be helpful. For instance, adding gateways to the City, upgrading soccer fields, and adding an ice skating rink so people don't have to leave the City. He said it would bring tourists. Councilman Ridgeway just felt it would be better to add amenities as line items instead of listing it under an umbrella name. The motion was carried on a 4-0 voice vote.

On Resolution No. 2018-19, transfers of funds were requested from Department Heads and different funds. Councilman Phares moved to approve the requests, and Councilman Wright seconded. The motion was carried on a 4-0 voice vote.

On Resolution No. 2018-20, Councilman Ridgeway moved to approve the fiscal plan for Timber Creek Village, and Councilman Phares seconded. Under discussion, Mayor DeBaun said a fiscal plan is required by Indiana Code for any annexation that is done to identify the potential costs to the City, such as police and fire services, trash pickup, etc. The motion was carried on a 4-0 voice vote.

There being no further business, Councilman Wright moved to adjourn.
