

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

March 12, 2019

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, March 12, 2019, at 8:32 A.M. All members were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on March 5, 2019, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Finkel moved to approve the claims as presented, and Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.


There was no old business.

Under new business, City Engineer Matt House came forward to say he had two contracts that he wanted to be approved. The first was with Zimmer Construction Engineering to do intersection improvements at Miller Street and McKay Road. A total of \$2.4 million was received last year to do intersection improvements, and the high school area was considered the best location to have a roundabout. Matt said the work would begin in 2022, and should be completed sometime in 2023. The high school was consulted, and Mr. Finkel said they liked the idea. Mr. Williams moved to approve the contract, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote. The second contract was with Commonwealth Engineers, Inc. to do general professional services for storm water and ditch projects in the City. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the contract, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under other business, Mayor DeBaun offered condolences to the Karnes family, especially for City WRRF employees Larry and Gary, for the loss of their father recently. Mayor DeBaun also offered condolences to County Commissioner Chris Ross for the loss of his family's son.

Mayor DeBaun wanted to thank the Street Department for their work on realigning the intersection of McKay Road, on cutting the curb back, and he has since received three positive phone calls.

There being no further business, Mr. Williams moved to adjourn.
