

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

March 19, 2019

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Common Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, March 19, 2019 at 8:30 A.M. All members were present. Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on March 12, 2019, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under old business, there were 2 orders to appear. The first to appear was Mr. Sullivan from 508 Tom Van Arden Drive. Mayor DeBaun stated after a follow up inspection, "you were found to be in compliance". There is no further action to be made at this time. The second, was at the address of 102 McKinley Street. The owner did not appear and there was proof of service. Per Mayor DeBaun, with failure to appear, proof of service and multiple contacts with this person, recommendation would be to order nuisance abated and the cost assessed to the taxes. Mr. Williams made a motion to approve and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.


Under new business, On Resolution 2019-1, transferring real estate from the City of Shelbyville to the City of Shelbyville Redevelopment Commission, Jenny Meltzer, City Attorney, representing the Redevelopment Commission came forward asking that the 11 acres be transferred to the Redevelopment Commission. The property is on the corner of I74 & ST Rd 44. The surrounding property is already owned by the Shelbyville Redevelopment Commission. Mayor DeBaun stated that the 11 acres had been donated to the city for retention. Mr. Finkel made a motion to approve the resolution and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Jenny also submitted a letter from John DePrez IV requesting customer only parking. It will be taken under advisement for the next meeting.

Matt House, City Engineer, presented a contract between the City of Shelbyville and the State of Indiana. This is a follow-up contract to the one that was signed last week with the consultant. It is for preliminary engineering which is paid 80% by the grant. It is \$275,000 paid for by state and federal funds for intersection improvements of Miller Street and McKay Road. Mr. Finkel made a motion to approve the contract as presented with clarification of the typo. Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was approved with a 3-0 voice vote. Mayor DeBaun had lunch with Shelby Senior Services for St. Patrick's Day on Friday and this was a positive topic of discussion. Understanding that traffic during school events, morning and afternoon dismissal is significant. He appreciated they took the time to discuss it.

Doug Hunt, Street Commissioner, announced heavy trash pick-up would be April 1st through the 5th on your regular trash day. Doug said "please keep it to a load per household. If you have questions pertaining to what can be picked up, check your local newspaper or call our office. Also, there will be no recycling during that week."

There being no further business, Mr. Williams moved to adjourn.




