

## BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

April 9, 2019

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, April 9, 2019, at 8:30 A.M. All members were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on April 2, 2019, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

There was no old business.

Under new business, City Engineer Matt House came forward to say he would like to have Commonwealth Engineers, Inc. provide engineering services on the Fortune Watershed Basin Study, and provide minor engineering tasks on an as needed basis. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the request, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.


Parks Director Karen Martin said she had a proposal from Bowen Engineering for a Guaranteed Savings Contract on the sewer issues at Blue River Memorial Park. With the expansion of so many events at the Park, larger sewer lines are needed, and the costs for the lines and a maintenance building are included in the bond proceeds. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the proposal, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote. Karen said the Parks Board will vote on the proposal tomorrow at their meeting.

Mayor DeBaun said Matt House has been talking with INDOT about the narrowing of S. Harrison St., from Van Ave. south to Noble St., after its recent reconstruction. It was felt that since vehicles are parking on that section of road, drivers have to dangerously cross the center line. Mr. Williams moved to put "No Parking" signs from Van Ave. south to Noble St., and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Melvin Pierce came forward to say he would like to cook on the Circle again this Friday and Saturday from 4 to 9 P.M. He said all went well and was successful last weekend, so he'd like to do it again. Police Chief Mark Weidner said no complaints had been received, so the Board was inclined to let him do it again. Mayor DeBaun stressed he didn't want this to be a weekly event, but he thought it was fine to let him do it again this weekend. Mr. Williams moved to allow Mel to set up again this weekend, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under other business, Mr. Finkel wanted to compliment the entire team of Shelbyville employees who had a hand in helping make yesterday's huge announcement from Greenleaf possible. Mayor DeBaun agreed, and said in his speech that it was a collaboration of sitting down with the Presbyterian Church, City and County officials, and the planning departments to see what the best possible use of that ground was. Mr. Williams thought this was a fantastic development, and the City and County will see the impact of this for years to come. After the event, Mayor DeBaun said he went to Kroger and bought several of their products in the cold case. He said his family will be trying them in the next few days. Mayor DeBaun said Greenleaf will be providing some of their products when the City hosts Municipal Government Day on the Circle. The products will be distributed and introduced to the public.

There being no further business, Mr. Williams moved to adjourn.
