Regular Meeting

May 14, 2019

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, May 14, 2019, at 8:30 A.M. All members were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.


Mr. Williams moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on May 8, 2019, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under old business, Mayor DeBaun asked Emma Williams, 407 Eberhart Drive, to come forward to talk about the order she received to clean up her property. Mayor DeBaun said it appeared, in current pictures, that she's been working to clean her property, but the Mayor also noted that this was the second time she's been ordered to appear before the Board. Emma noted that most has been hauled away, but she still has relatives living there that cause additional trash, and the City only picks up three trash bags per week. Mayor DeBaun said the extra trash could be taken to the County Highway Garage all day, and someone should take the trash when it's necessary. Mr. Williams said it's important to keep the property clean so her neighbor doesn't constantly call the City. Mr. Finkel moved to allow two weeks to clean everything up, and if it is clean, then the Board won't order her to appear. Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under new business, Mr. Finkel talked about the poor conditions of the railroad crossings in the City over years past, and he wanted to congratulate the Mayor and his team for getting CSX to fix the crossings in the City. He said it was a very difficult process to get CSX to finally start doing the necessary work on the crossings. Mayor DeBaun thanked Mr. Finkel for his remarks, he thanked his staff, and he thanked former Senator Joe Donnelly and his staff for helping get everything moving forward.

There being no further business, Mr. Williams moved to adjourn.
