

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

July 2, 2019

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, July 2, 2019, at 8:32 A.M. All members were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on June 25, 2019, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Finkel moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under old business, Mayor DeBaun said it was the recommendation of the City Engineer to go with Robertson Paving as the low bidder last week on the Overlay Program, Packet #2. Their bid was \$1,526,615.60. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the low bid, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under new business, Plan Commission Director Adam Rude talked about a notice being sent and signed by E J Reynolds to appear today for an unsafe building at 111 E. Hendricks St. No one appeared for the hearing and Adam said there were three units at the address. The conditions are terrible and he feels it's important to have it vacated and sealed. Although he feels it should be demolished, he will have the property inspected to see if it can be saved. Mr. Finkel moved to have the property vacated and sealed, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Police Chief Mark Weidner had conditional offers of employment for two people on their hiring list. They are Zach Crafton and Garrett Phillips, and the Chief stressed these are not new positions. They are replacements for positions that need to be filled. Mr. Williams moved to approve the request, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Jordan England, with Mainstreet Shelbyville and Director of First Fridays, requested permission to close W. Washington St., from the alley by the Methodist Building to Tompkins St., for first Friday events in August, September, and October. She would like it closed from 6:00 A.M. until 11:00 P.M. Jordan also asked after 6:00 P.M., when the bank closes, that the alley be closed up to the Square. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the requests, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Before opening the bids, Mr. Finkel wanted to thank everyone for their patience during the overlay projects that have happened on several streets in the City, and he wanted to compliment the Street and Police Departments for working on traffic control during the overlay at the Casino area. Mayor DeBaun said he received an email from Robertson Paving thanking them as well.

Mayor DeBaun had three different sets of bids to open this morning. The first set of bids to be opened was for the Maintenance Building to be constructed at Blue River Memorial Park, with the companies and bid amounts listed below:

Mr. Williams moved to take the bids under advisement, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was tabled on a 3-0 voice vote.

The second set of bids was for the rebuilding of Hodell and Prospect St. The following companies, along with their bid amounts, are listed below:

Mr. Finkel moved to take the bids under advisement, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was tabled on a 3-0 voice vote. The engineer's estimate was \$201,160.00.

The third set of bids was for the reconstruction of W. Franklin St. from Habig to Elliott St. The following companies, along with their asphalt and/or concrete bid amounts, are listed below:

Matt House said the engineer's estimate for the asphalt was \$475,200, and the concrete estimate was \$542,245.00. Mr. Finkel moved to take the bids under advisement, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was tabled on a 3-0 voice vote.

There being no further business, Mr. Williams moved to adjourn.
