

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

July 9, 2019

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, July 9, 2019, at 8:29 A.M. All members were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on July 2, 2019, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.


Under old business, Mayor DeBaun said it was the recommendation of City Engineer Matt House to go with Midwest Paving on the W. Franklin St. project, from Habig to Elliott St., at a total of \$420,784.50, including undistributed quantities. Mr. Williams moved to approve the lowest bid, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

At the recommendation of Matt House, Mayor DeBaun awarded Midwest Paving again on their low bid, on the rebuilding of Hodell and Prospect St., at a total of \$175,967.80. This also includes undistributed quantities. Mr. Williams moved to approve the low bid, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under new business, Mayor DeBaun asked Ron Cameron to come forward to tell the Board what his plans were for the property at 651 W. Franklin St., having been given two weeks to determine what he would do. Mr. Cameron said he would like to tear the house down, and put a barn in its place. Mayor DeBaun wanted Mr. Cameron to be clear that he needs to meet the compliance of the zoning code. Mr. Finkel moved to allow sixty days to demolish the home, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote. Mr. Cameron said he would put yellow sealed tape around the home, and the City won't have to do it.


