

COMMON COUNCIL

Regular Meeting

July 1, 2019

The regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Common Council Chambers of City Hall on Monday, July 1, 2019, at 6:59 P.M. Councilwoman Bowen opened with the Pledge of Allegiance, and Councilman Ridgeway followed that with a prayer. Councilmen Nolley and Asher were absent, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Councilman Wright moved to approve the minutes of the June 17, 2019 meeting, and Councilman Phares seconded. The motion was carried on a 5-0 voice vote.

Under miscellaneous business, Councilman Wright moved to approve the City Financial Reports for May, and Councilman Phares seconded. The motion was carried on a 5-0 voice vote.

Under old business, on Ordinance No. 19-2860, approving and ratifying an executive order of the Mayor amending the capital improvement plan, Councilwoman Bowen moved to approve the request on second and final reading, and Councilman Ridgeway seconded. Under discussion, Mayor DeBaun said this would allow an expenditure of up to \$110,000.00 from EDIT monies to make repairs to the pond in Southern Trace. The motion was carried on a 5-0 voice vote.


Under new business, on compliance with statement of benefits for Knauf Insulation and PK U.S.A., Inc., Councilman Phares said their committee met on Friday and recommended approval to the full Council. Councilman Wright moved to approve compliance forms for both companies, and Councilman Phares seconded. The motion was carried on a 5-0 voice vote.

Under other business, Parks Director Karen Martin came forward to talk about the Splash Pad at Blue River Memorial Park. Karen said many problems have been found recently; but concrete was poured today, and the Pad should be open by Wednesday.

Under comments or requests from citizens, Brandy Coomes, Executive Director of Mainstreet, wanted to thank everyone who helped or participated in the Wine Walk event last Friday evening. She said 776 tickets were sold, and Mayor DeBaun said he received positive comments on the music played on the steps of City Hall. Fred Eaton, also with Mainstreet, said Friday's Wine Walk was the second largest attendance of the five year period. Also, he said one winery left very happy because they sold 171 bottles of wine.

Dawn Houchin, on behalf of the Healthy Shelby County Coalition, wanted to invite everyone to their Get Healthy Here event on Saturday, July 13, at the Farmers Market from 8:00 A.M. until 12 noon. Also, she said the neighborhood farmers mobile food market starts tomorrow night. It will be held every other week on Tuesday at the Parks Dept., on Wednesday at Builder's Lumber, and Thursday at First Presbyterian Church.

There being no further business, Councilman Wright moved to adjourn.
