

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

July 23, 2019

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, July 23, 2019, at 8:34 A.M. All members were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on July 16, 2019, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under old business, Engineer Assistant John Kuntz recommended the approval of Ottenweller Contracting's bid of \$128,894.00 for the Southern Trace Pond Remediation. Mr. Williams moved to approve the request, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote. City Attorney Jenny Meltzer said the contract agreement between the City and Southern Trace would need to be amended to \$129,000.00. The contract was for \$110,000.00 originally. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the contract change, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under new business, Jenny asked permission to approve a utility easement between the City of Shelbyville and Indiana American Water Co., Inc., for the POET property. Mr. Williams moved to approve the request, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Plan Commission Director Adam Rude said the Post Office would like to relocate their collection box from 1015 E. St. Rd. 44 to 901 Fair Ave., right by the entrance to the Shelby Co. Fair. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the relocation, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Adam said a notice of violation was sent to the current resident and the owner of 347 E. Mechanic St. on July 1, to remove junk and debris from their property within ten days. That didn't happen, so he's asking permission to notify the current resident and the owner for an order to appear two weeks from today. The owner's address is in Irmo, South Carolina. Mr. Williams moved to approve issuing an order to appear on August 6, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Adam said a notice of violation was sent to the residence at 1116 St. Joseph St. on July 3, to remove the junk and debris within ten days. Nothing has been done to clean it and the trash has gotten worse, so Mr. Finkel moved to issue an order to appear, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.


