

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

August 20, 2019

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, August 20, 2019, at 8:29 A.M. All members were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on August 13, 2019, and Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under old business, City Engineer Matt House recommended the bids of Robertson Paving that were opened last week for the Loper Trail and Blue River Trail Millings. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the recommendation, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.


Plan Commission Director Adam Rude came forward to talk about the property at 102 McKinley St. No one from that address appeared for today's hearing, where trash in the rear had not been cleaned up. Mr. Finkel moved to have the trash removed by the City and assess the charges to the property's taxes, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.


Under new business, Mr. Rude asked for an order to appear for the owners at 548 W. Hendricks St. because they have grass, trash, and debris in their yard that has not been cleaned when given ten days notice. Mayor DeBaun said he and Troy Merrick, Code Enforcement Officer, went to the property yesterday to take pictures, and talked with the residents. They said they would start cleaning the property, but nothing had been done as of this morning. Mr. Williams moved to issue an order to appear, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mayor DeBaun read a letter from Jordan England, Director of First Friday events for Mainstreet Shelbyville, requesting permission to close the west half of the Public Square from midnight until 10:00 P.M. on September 6. The event will have a Touch-A-Truck for the kids in the first block of W. Washington St., and a Car Show Cruise-In for the adults inside the Circle. Mr. Williams moved to approve the request, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

There being no further business, Mr. Williams moved to adjourn.
