

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

October 1, 2019

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, October 1, 2019, at 8:27 A.M. All members were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on September 24, 2019, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under old business, Mayor DeBaun asked the owner of property at 910 Elm St., Dustin Crosby, to come forward. Mr. Crosby was ordered to appear because of grass, weeds, and debris in his yard not being cleaned up in a timely manner. Mr. Crosby said he has cut his grass, and Mr. Finkel said the other items weren't that big, so Mr. Crosby said he could clean it up within two weeks. Mr. Finkel moved to continue this for two weeks to clean the property at 910 Elm St., and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote. Mayor DeBaun told Mr. Crosby that he didn't have to come back if the Code Enforcement Officer was satisfied with the work that was done to clean the property.

Under new business, Brandy Coomes, Executive Director of Mainstreet Shelbyville, requested permission to close a few parking spaces on the west half of the Public Square on Friday, October 11, from 11:00 A.M. until 3:00 P.M. As part of Downtown Development Week from October 7-11, Brandy would like to have Thornburg's Pineapple Whip on the Circle on Friday, October 11, near the fountain. Mr. Williams moved to approve the request, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mayor DeBaun told high school students, attending for government class, and the audience that bids for the detention pond at Greenleaf's new company will be opened, there will be an approximate ten minute recess to review them, and then the bid will be awarded. The following companies, along with their bid amounts for the Tindall Property Regional Detention Pond, are listed below:



After a short recess, City Engineer Matt House said he met with City Attorney Jenny Meltzer, Street Commissioner Doug Hunt, and Engineer Assistant John Kuntz to review the bids. Mr. House recommended that the low bid from Walls Excavating, totaling \$382,380.00, be approved. Representatives from Walls Excavating were present for the bid openings, so they were interviewed privately, and confirmed they could meet all of the requirements needed for all of the deadlines. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the low bid from Walls Excavating, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under other business, Mr. Finkel said there will be a Golden Bear Preschool dedication ceremony this afternoon at 4:00 P.M., at the old Marsh location site. He said it will be a good chance for the public to see the school and the Administrative side as well.

Mayor DeBaun asked each of the high school students to stand, introduce themselves, say what their future plans are, who their teacher is, and what class they're in.

There being no further business, Mr. Williams moved to adjourn.
