

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

November 6, 2019

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Common Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, November 6, 2019 at 8:30 A.M. All members were present. Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on October 29, 2019, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under old business, there were 3 orders to appear. The first notice was sent to Shelby Capital LLC. and to residents from 328-330 W. Mechanic Street and the second, was sent to Ronald Richards for the address of 852 W. Franklin Street. The owners did not appear and there was proof of service. Per Mayor DeBaun, with failure to appear, proof of service and multiple contacts with these people, recommendation would be to order nuisance abated and the cost assessed to the taxes. The resident at the address of 328 W. Mechanic Street contacted Mr. Rude, and stated that none of the trash was his. It all belonged to the tenant at 330 W. Mechanic Street. Mr. Finkel made a motion to approve with clean up and the cost to be assessed to the taxes. Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote. The 3rd order to appear was to Allen and Allen LLC. Justin Polston, appeared for the company, regarding the tenant at 815 Morris Avenue. He said he was trying to get everything cleaned up but there were still some things that need to be done. Mr. Finkel made a motion to approve with clean up and the cost to be assessed to the taxes. Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote. There were 2 other properties that letters were sent to: 332 W. Locust Street, and 271 E. Franklin Street. They were cleaned up and told they didn't have to appear.

Under new business, Police Chief, Mark Weidner, came forward to ask permission to extend a conditional offer of employment to Adis Ibrekic. The offer would be contingent upon his relocation to Shelby County or one of the contiguous counties.


Next appeared Karen Martin, Shelbyville Parks Department and Matt House, City Engineer. Mr. House asked to do a change order for the original contract for the Parks Department. This would be to add on \$10,000 for stone. Mrs. Martin said they could wait until next year, if needed. Mayor DeBaun suggested to move forward on the needed stone because if the contractor had to move on to something else, we wouldn't know when we would be able to get them back here. Mr. Williams made a motion to approve the expense for the stone and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Next Mayor DeBaun read a letter from Gregg LeMasters. He was substituting at the Shelbyville High School and had a fainting spell. His letter was to "thank" the Shelbyville response team. They acted in a confident and professional manner. He felt safe in their care and it was reassuring to him to know that such people work for the City of Shelbyville.


Under miscellaneous business, Brandy Coombs appeared regarding the closure of the parking lot on E. Washington Street (next to Sharp's Trophies by Mack) for setting up tents for December 7, 2019 for the Mistletoe Market. Mr. Williams said he had a condition for the event. It would be for them to speak with all the store owners in that block. Also, signs will be needed for the bank. He also mentioned that they need to check out the space they will need for the stage. Mr. Finkel made a motion to accept with the stated conditions and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.
