

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

December 10, 2019

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, December 10, 2019, at 8:33 A.M. All members were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on December 3, 2019, and Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0-1 voice vote, with Mr. Finkel abstaining.

Mr. Finkel moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

There was no old business.

Under new business, City Attorney Jenny Meltzer presented an economic development project and purchase agreement between the City of Shelbyville and Westport Homes. The plan is to construct approximately 90 single-family homes on the east side of Amos Rd. just north of Twin Lakes Apartments. Infrastructure costs of up to \$315,000.00 will be split into four sections after every 22 homes are built. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the agreement, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Plan Commission Director Adam Rude asked permission to have an order to appear notice sent to the owners at 735 Blanchard Street. Mr. Rude said nothing has been done to clean the junk and debris in their yard in the last month. Mr. Williams moved to have an order to appear notice sent to the owners, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.


There being no further business, Mayor DeBaun asked Brad Fix, Water Resource Recovery Facility Superintendent, to come forward. Mayor DeBaun presented Brad a plaque with two sets of dates. The first was from 1980 until July 31, 2010, and the second was from September 13, 2010 until the end of 2019. Brad said he served under six Mayors, all of whom are still living, and Mr. Finkel said three of those Mayors were in the room today. He also said he was shy six weeks of serving forty years for the City. Brad said it will be bittersweet leaving what he called “family”, saying it will be tough. Mayor DeBaun thanked Brad for all of his service to the City.

Mayor DeBaun asked the two high school students in the audience to stand, introduce themselves, and name their teacher, who was Mr. Bradburn.

Mr. Finkel asked Brad Fix when the Treatment Plant was started. Brad said it was started in 1958, and completed in 1960. Of those sixty years, Mr. Finkel noted Brad has been there forty of those years. Mayor DeBaun said Brad’s always fond of saying he’s #1 in the #2 business, drawing laughter from all in the room.

There being no further business, Mr. Williams moved to adjourn.
