

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

January 14, 2020

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, January 14, 2020, at 8:30 A.M. All members were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Finkel moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on January 7, 2020, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.


In old business, Mayor DeBaun presented a contract request from Duke Energy for the Hamilton Major Light Project. This is a contract to pay for 11 street lights. Proposal is to pay full amount at the cost of \$39,492.96. This will save the city from paying the interest. Mr. Williams moved to approve the proposal as presented, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under new business, Mayor DeBaun presented Board of Public Works & Safety Resolution 2020-1 which is a real estate swap for the trail project. This is a quick claim deal with no money changing hands. The city will be trading a landlocked 9/10 acre triangle lot adjoining the Blue River and property that is owned by Randy Robinson for some right of way on Habig St. This will allow the city to put in a multi-use trail along Habig St. that will connect to River Rd. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the Board of Public Works & Public Safety Resolution 2020-1, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.


Also under new business, Plan Director Adam Rude reported a trash violation on 305 Sunset Dr. The property is not being held to the city standards. This is not the first offense for this property. The city is asking to issue an order to appear for Barbara Johnson. Mr. Finkel moved to approve that the city send an issue to appear to Mrs. Johnson, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

There being no further business, Mr. Finkel moved to adjourn.
