

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

January 28, 2020

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, January 28, 2020, at 8:30 A.M. Mr. Finkel was absent, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the claims and minutes from the January 21, 2020 meeting as presented, and Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0 voice vote.

Under old business, Mary McCarty, SIRPC Project Development Manager gave an update on the owner occupied rehabilitation program. During this phase, 14 homes were completed focusing on homes owned by the elderly and disabled. Projects ranged from roof repair, ADA restrooms, ramps, heating and cooling, electrical and lead based paint. After completion of presentation, Mayor DeBaun opened the floor for public discussion; being none he concluded the public hearing portion.

Under new business, Mr. Williams moved to approve a request for an order to appear for 629 E. Jackson Street, Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0 voice vote.

Mr. Williams moved to approve a request for an order to appear for 102 McKinley Street, Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0 voice vote.

Mr. Williams moved to approve a request for an order to appear for 558 E. Broadway Street, Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0 voice vote.

City attorney, Jenny Meltzer presented a contract to extend the gas line for the Hamilton Major project. This is a 6 year contract that will not cost the city anything. Mr. Williams moved to approve, Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0 voice vote.


