

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

March 3, 2020

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, March 3, 2020, at 8:30 A.M. All members were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Finkel moved to approve the minutes of the February 25, 2020 meeting, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0-1 voice vote. Mayor DeBaun abstained from the vote.

In old business, Mr. Finkel made a motion to uphold the Board's decision on the disciplinary matter of Clifford Coffman based on the finding of facts by the Board, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

In other old business, Adam Rude, Director of the Plan Commission requested an emergency clean up on properties located at 736 S. Noble St. and 131 E. Mechanic St. These properties are owned by EJ Rentals. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the clean up, and Mr. Williams seconded. Mr. Rude also requested an order to appear for the properties at 809 Indiana Ave. and 811 Indiana Ave. These properties are owned by Gregg Spegal Revocable Trust and are deemed a nuisance. Mr. Williams moved to approve the order, Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

In new business, Chief Logan requested the Board to accept Chris Lee's retirement notice. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the retirement notice, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote. Chief Logan also asked the Board to consider an additional hire, Cody Everette, pending a few tests still to be completed. Mr. Williams moved to approve the new hire, seconded by Mr. Finkel. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

After a short recess, the meeting resumed with another item from old business. Misty Collins represented her dog in the dog bite case from February 21, 2020. The dog was kept at the shelter to be monitored for demeanor after a physical altercation in a garage had set the dog off. The dog was not current on rabies vaccinations. Ms. Collins explained that "Ollie" is very protective towards her. She visited the dog at the shelter throughout the week and if returned she would agree to update vaccinations. Mr. Williams moved to release the dog to the owner pending proper vaccinations, seconded by Mr. Finkel. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

There being no further business, Mr. Williams moved to adjourn.
