

COMMON COUNCIL

Regular Meeting

March 2, 2020

The regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Common Council Chambers of City Hall on Monday, March 2, 2020, at 7:00 P.M. Councilman Willis opened with the Pledge of Allegiance, and Councilman Conrady followed that with the prayer. Councilman Nolley was absent, Mayor DeBaun presided.

Councilman Conrady moved to approve the minutes of the February 17, 2020 meeting, and Councilman Johnson seconded. The motion was carried on a 6-0 voice vote.

Councilman Asher moved to approve the financial report as presented, Councilman Furgeson seconded. The motion was carried on a 6-0 voice vote.

Under old business, Councilwoman Bowen moved to approve the second reading of Ordinance 20-2875, Councilman Conrady seconded. The ordinance is to reestablish the Cum Cap development rate. Vote was carried on a 6-0 voice vote.

In new business, Councilman Asher moved to approve Resolution No. 2020-9, Councilwoman Bowen seconded. Vote was carried on a 6-0 voice vote. This resolution approved a lease between the Redevelopment Authority and Redevelopment Commission. Barnes and Thornburg and Financial Solutions were both on hand to answer any questions.

Councilman Asher moved to approve the first reading of Ordinance 20-2877, Councilman Willis seconded. The ordinance is to create a revolving loan fund with the city of Shelbyville. Vote was carried on a 6-0 voice vote. Councilman Furgeson, Chair of the Ordinance Committee, was available to go over stipulations and parameters of these loans.

Councilman Willis moved to approve Resolution 2020-8, Councilman Asher seconded. This resolution authorized Cadillac Jacks LLC. availability for a Riverfront Liquor License. Vote was carried on a 5-0-1 voice vote. Councilman Furgeson abstained.

Councilman Asher moved to approve Resolution No. 2020-10 which is an amendment to Resolution No. 2018-18, Councilwoman Bowen seconded. Vote was carried on a 6-0 voice vote. This is to change how Racino funds are allocated. The categories remain the same as the percentages have changed.

There were no reports from department heads.

In committee reports, Councilman Furgeson, Chair of Ordinance Committee announced that the committee and the city attorney are working on an ordinance to address water fowl issues and the feeding of water fowl.

Councilman Conrady has been working with personnel in attempts to put in place a reward system for employees going above and beyond their actual job.


